- With the Vodafone Navigation app there's no need to have a dedicated Sat Nav as you can get full turn by turn voice guidance right there on your phone.

 - If you're low on petrol you'll never have to worry as you can search through millions of points of interest, including petrol stations.

 - You can customise the app as you like including making maps full screen, both landscape or portrait as well as night mode which means the screen dims so you don't get dazzled in the dark.
 - Best of all, the maps are updated at least four times per year so you'll never get sent up a dead end again.
