

Entertainment apps video transcript

Hi, I'm Jamie and I'm going to show you two great apps for your iPhone.

If you've ever seen something online that you don't quite have the time to read, you'll know that it'd be really useful to press a button and have it appear in the Read it later app on your iPhone.

And then you can read it at your leisure – perhaps on the tube or on the train.

With the Read it later app, you can save pages from Safari, Twitter, many other apps – and not to mention your PC's browser. Once saved, you can read them any time, even if you don't have an internet connection.

To read a football story I saved earlier, I open the Read it later app, and there it is, ready in my reading list.

Even better, if I don't want to see the whole page, I can simply tap the 'T' and transform it into a very easy to read plan text view.

This is the way I read most stories on my phone as it's so much easier than scrolling through huge web pages.

The app saves the position of each page I read. So if I don't finish reading one, if I go back to it, it's still in the same place I left it.

Finally, to make sure you can find all of your saved pages, it's really easy to just swipe and tag a story. I tag all my football stories with 'footy'.

For anybody who likes Sudoku, Sudoku Grab is a great app. Once downloaded, you can use your phone's camera to grab any Sudoku puzzle from anywhere.

When in a puzzle, press the menu button and you can share with a friend via email. You can complete the puzzles, make different coloured notes, or even use the hints button to fill it in for you.

You can grab as many puzzles as you want – and the app has a handy tagging system, so you can always remember where you grabbed them from.

Finally, when you're on the move you don't want to worry about saving your progress. So the app automatically saves every time you exit.
