


# **The Captaincy**








- Wales veteran Alun Wyn Jones is the fans' overwhelming favourite for the armband with 40% of the vote, clear of fellow contenders Maro Itoje (22%), Stuart Hogg (20%) and Owen Farrell (10%).
- Even England fans are leaning towards the Welshman, although he is currently neck-and-neck with Saracens lock Maro Itoje.
   Both have 27% each of the vote amongst the English, with Owen Farrell in third on 22% and Stuart Hogg just behind on 20%.
- This is a huge shift from the start of the seaoson: before February 8th, Maro Itoje and Owen Farrell were neck-and-neck at the top of
  the pile with 35% of the vote each, with Jones a distant third on 23%. Stuart Hogg was nowhere to be seen, with only 5% of fans
  picking him as captain pre-tournament.

## The Dead Certs




- Maro Itoje, Conor Murray, Finn Russell, Stuart Hogg and Louis Rees-Zammit are all nailed-on starters according to the data, with fans of every home nation picking them in their squad for the first Test against the Springboks.
- Tadgh Furlong likewise is a firm favourite to start at prop (47% of the vote), with England fans the only group not to include him in their starting XV, preferring an all-English front row of Mako Vunipola, Luke Cowan Dickie and Kyle Sinckler.




#### **Under Threat**






- Owen Farrell (45%) lost out to Finn Russell (69%) at number 10, and is moved to the subs bench with Robbie Henshaw (38%) given the nod at centre.
- Even England fans now prefer Russell at fly half, and Scottish fans have dropped the England captain (33%) from the starting XV entirely, with Russell (86%) at number 10 and a pairing of Cameron Redpath (38%) and Garry Ringrose (37%) at 12 and 13.

### Close calls







- Maro Itoje (77%) is a nailed-on starter according to Lions fans, but there is still debate over who should appear alongside him on the second row. Alun Wyn Jones (50%) is the current front runner, but despite him being the clear favourite for captain he does not make it into Ireland or Scotland fans' first XVs, who prefer James Ryan (52%) and Jonny Gray (56%) respectively.
- There is also a tight battle to decide who will play on the opposite wing to Louis Rees-Zammit (56%). Bath star Anthony Watson currently leads on 40%, ahead of his England teammate Jonny May on 37%, but both face a challenge from Duhan van der Merwe (30%), as he looks to take on his birth country.



### Wildcards





- Not a single fan picked **Tadgh Beirne** before February 8th, but following a superb tournament he now features in **21%** of teams. He doesn't make the fans' starting line ups, but he does get himself a well-deserved place on the plane.
- One game may have made a summer for Cameron Redpath, whose single appearance against England at the start of the month was enough to see him rise from less than 1% to 18% of the vote and the fringes of the selection conversation. For Scotland fans the impact was even greater, who have him in the starting XV with 38% of the vote, above Owen Farrell (33%).
- English trio Manu Tuilagi, Sam Simmonds and Sam Underhill haven't lost out with the fans despite not making Eddie Jones' squad all three have received enough votes so far to make the plane, and fans are hoping Tuilagi's achilles heals in time.
